Eric Sheninger is a Senior Fellow and Thought Leader on Digital Leadership with the International Center for Leadership in Education (ICLE) and Scholastic Achievement Partners as well as the Director of Technology and Innovation for K-12 in the Spotswood School District in New Jersey. An award-winning former principal of New Milford High School, he is globally recognized for creating student-centered, collaborative learning environments that will prepare learners to succeed in the 21st century.

A recipient of numerous awards, Mr. Sheninger has emerged as an innovative leader and captivating and engaging speaker who inspires his audiences to harness the power of technology through the use of social media and web 2.0 technology. His presentations often are authentic demonstrations that reflect the philosophies and practices he shares with his audiences.
